EXAMPLES OF WORK:

Position is responsible for skilled electrical work associated with installing, checking and repairing electrical systems and equipment associated with the Wastewater Department. Tasks are performed in accordance with standard trade practices. Assignments are made in the form of written or oral instructions and may be accompanied by sketches and blueprints; however, work also arises out of inspections and troubleshooting. Ordinarily, routine work is performed independently; assistance may be necessary on difficult or unusual problems. All work is subject to inspection while in progress or upon completion. The incumbent works with substantial independence. Position reports to the Director and Pump Station Foreman. Keeps electrical equipment such as wiring, motors, batteries, switches, PLCs, controls and electrical mechanisms in repair and good operating condition. Replaces defective wiring, runs conduit, and makes connections for electrical installations. Replaces burned out fuses and small parts on motors; cleans and oils motors. Removes and makes installations of fixtures, motors, and other electrical equipment. Installs and maintains wiring connections on control panels, fans, motors, generators, starting devices for pumps, and metering devices. Tests the installation of equipment using meters to determine insulation resistance. Keeps appropriate records on equipment. Performs related work as required such as regular inspections of pumping stations for timely and effective pump operation. With labor assistance, clears area and removes pumps, motors, transports to workshop for re-building and /or repair. With an assistant replaces motors, pumps and assures proper functioning.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

High school diploma or equivalent, supplemented by vocational technical school training, and experience in electrical work which included troubleshooting and working with high voltage electricity; or any equivalent combination of training, electrical contractor's license and experience and a valid Louisiana driver's license are required, with Commercial Driver's License desired. Must meet the general requirements of the City's auto insurance company. Knowledge of the standard practices, materials, tools, and equipment of the electrical trade. Knowledge of the occupational hazards and safety precautions of the trade. Some knowledge of a wide variety of mechanical and electrical systems, equipment, and control devices. Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions, and to read and interpret blueprints, sketches, logic ladder schematics and diagrams. Ability to locate and adjust defects in electrical systems, equipment, and control devices, as is experience with electrically driven liquid pump systems. Ability to maintain records and prepare simple reports. Ability to develop and maintain effective working relationships with superiors and other employees. Skill in the use and care of tools and equipment of the electrical trade. Department of Health and Hospitals Waste Water Collection Certification at Level II is highly desired for these positions, and Level III is required for promotion to foreman. Must pass the civil service exam, the post-offer drug screen, physical, and functional pre-placement testing. Must be a qualified registered voter and submit verification with the application.
